



Graduate Certificate in Teaching Religious Education



Study online: 4 Saturday intensives each semester

The **Graduate Certificate in Teaching Religious Education** (GCTRE) prepares graduate teachers (or equivalent) to teach religious education. It provides students with knowledge of the disciplines, principles, practices, and traditions that form the basis for religious education. It is designed specifically to meet the requirements of CECV Policy.

Entry requirements

- Successful completion of an undergraduate degree, or an approved equivalent
- A qualification recognised for teacher accreditation in Australia.

Course structure

4 units (18 points each)

This course is offered part-time, 1 unit per semester over 2 years. Each unit has Saturday intensive sessions (see overleaf).

Accreditation and sponsorship

This is a recognised course for teacher accreditation and sponsored study in **all** Victorian dioceses. In other dioceses, teachers should check with their education office.

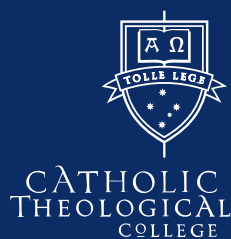

First Years

Semester 1

[**BS8610Z Introduction to the Bible for Teachers**](#)

This unit introduces students to the bible by focusing on the formation of the bible, its origins, and key historical events. The first two sessions consider key sections of the Old Testament. The second two sessions consider key sections of the New Testament and how these are interpreted within the Catholic Tradition.

Semester 2

[**CT8620Z Introduction to Theology for Teachers**](#)
