Since its establishment in 1933, St Joseph's School Red Cliffs has been inspired by the charism of the Sisters of Mercy and is committed to instilling Catholic values and the holistic development of each student. St Joseph's is very well resourced in terms of staffing and facilities. A successful application for a capital grant, augmented by the generous fundraising efforts of parents, resulted in the construction of the new Administration building, an upgrade of junior classrooms and the installation of a new 'nature-based' playground.

The school is committed to numerous community service, ecological, environmental and social justice activities which are linked to Scripture and Christ's message to reach out to the vulnerable.
